

Marie McCully Collier Population and Public Health Student Award 2020

Overview

The Marie McCully Collier Award was established in 2017 by the Public Health Association of Nova Scotia. This award will be given to a post-secondary student studying in the health professions, or in another field with a focus on an issue related to health. The current value of this award is \$500, and will be awarded to support the recipient's development as an advocate and leader in the fields of population and public health. This is a one-time, non-renewable award.

This application should be completed electronically and returned via mail or e-mail. Original (not electronic) signatures on this form, and on letters of reference, are preferred. Scanned copies of signed forms will be accepted in PDF format. Background

This award pays tribute to Marie McCully Collier – a retired registered nurse and Public Health manager who has made significant contributions to the field of public health on a provincial and federal level. Among her many professional achievements, Marie has been publicly recognized for her contributions in translating research into public health practice and workforce development. She served as Board President for the Public Health Association of Nova Scotia, and is past co-chair and a founding member of Maggie's Place, a family resource centre serving Colchester and Cumberland counties. Marie is recognized as one of Canada's most respected facilitators of online learning, as well as mentor, role model, change agent, and volunteer.

Eligibility Criteria

For 2020, this award is valued at \$500, and will be awarded to a student who meets the following criteria:

- Is currently registered as a full- or part-time student at a Nova Scotia University or college (undergraduate and graduate students are eligible)
- Is a dues-paying member of PHANS (Student, regular or retired membership)
- Is actively engaged in volunteer activities with PHANS and/or other organizations with a mandate relevant to population and public health in Nova Scotia

Applicants must also complete the attached application form, and include one letter of reference from a supervisor, instructor, mentor (etc) who can speak to their academic, volunteer, and/or professional achievements as they relate to this award. This letter of reference should speak to a combination of the candidate's academic qualifications and dedication to advocacy and volunteerism in a field related to population and public health.
